#### B. Programs

- 1. Sarah entered a drawing and won a copy of the book The Brilliant Calculator for the library.
- 2. The Little Bookshop on Market Street raised \$560.37 for the Friends of the Library! 80 NMPL bucks were redeemed by Summer Reading participants. There were rides from Juliette the Unicorn and caricatures by Randy Martin, as well as food from Tacos Los Gordos and live music from library patron Randy Ragan.
- Sam McFadden of the Community Foundation of Wabash County came to the second Summer Art Series to officially present the big check for the Good Deeds grant that NMPL received. Sarah plans to apply for the grant again next year.
- 4. The first batch of science kits from the Science Kits for Public Libraries grant have arrived. Sarah and a volunteer are in the process of reboxing the kits for circulation.
- 5. The Gazebo plants, Shade Garden, Pollinator Garden, and Dirty Diggers' raised beds and pots will get a little extra help this summer. Manchester University Peace & Environmental Studies students under the direction of Dr. Katharine Brown will assist Sarah by watering these areas on a weekly basis.
- 6. The numbers for the Teen/Adult Summer Reading are blowing past years numbers out of the water. Molly has been hearing amazing feedback from the patrons one lady mentioned that she normally just reads and does not collect the section prizes because she has no use for them, but this year she actually claimed the prizes since it was items she could use and needed.
- 7. Sarah and Molly decided to cut back on their "normal" day to day programs during Summer Reading since they are already doing so many bigger events/programs. This gave Molly the opportunity to clean/purge/organize her office, the storage closet off the playroom, and the Makerspace. Molly was assisted by NMPL volunteer Bronwyn, and

- NMPL clerk Josh. Molly will take time every summer to clean and organize those spaces to keep them up to date. Molly feels the project has helped her learn and know what all items the library has and has given her some program ideas for the fall.
- 8. The Makerspace now has clear and designated stations. There is the 'Relax and Chill' station that has all cushion seating around a coffee table that houses some deck of cards and a white board. There are also the shelves that have all different kinds of board games to play. The Makerspace now has a scrapbooking station with a designated scrapbooking table and scrapbooking supplies. Molly organized the shelves to hold interactables like Legos, playdough, blade runners, sewing items, and more. There are also art shelves that hold Perler beads, crayons, makers, colored pencils, and coloring books. The Makerspace now has a Gaming Corner, with video games, comfy chairs, air hockey, table tennis, foosballs, and a giant connect 4. Molly added a Magic the Gathering Station with cards and a designated table for playing. There are also designated paint tables and a cart of supplies.
